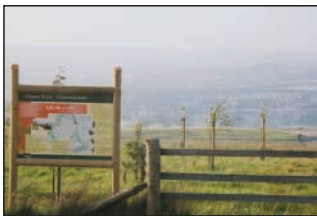
This incredibly attractive area was launched on Tuesday 3rd June 2003. Opened by the Mayor and Mayoress of Burnley, Crown Point, Burnley has been specially selected for its high landscape beauty and general natural appeal.

The site which is immediately adjacent to a spacious car park on Crown Point Road, makes visiting to the 'Life for a Life' Memorial Forest very easy especially to those clients that are either wheelchair users or unable to walk very far unaided.

Almost as soon as you arrive at the gate to the planting site, the uninterrupted view over Burnley Town to the Pendle Hills is staggering to say the least. All plantings at this site will be on the left hand side of the newly constructed pathway which zig zags down to the lower gentle slopes to join the "Ramblers Way" at a lower level. Additional to this remarkably lovely area is the enjoyable sight of the town lights, twinkling in the distance. This is especially beautiful during the winter months and at Christmas time.

This truly splendid 'Life for a Life' Memorial Forest will quickly become a much sought after place of remembrance.

Burnley has an enviable reputation for its military history over many centuries therefore the Crown Point area will be of particular interest to all ex-services personnel. As in all of the 'Life for a Life' planting areas a special corner referred to as "Warriors Rest" is set aside. Present on the day of the official opening of the site members of The Queens Lancashire Regiment planted a Memorial Tree on behalf of all of the past and present members of the regiment and the uniformed branches of the emergency services.
