Opened on Tuesday 15th July 2003 by the Deputy Lieutenant of Merseyside. St. Joseph's is the first of several 'Life for a Life' Memorial Forests envisaged for the Liverpool conurbation.

The planting area is situated in the middle of a larger forested aspect. Many of the existing trees are protected species. The 'Life for a Life' memorial trees will, over time, add to the splendour of the Hospice grounds. The wildflower meadow, where the memorial trees are planted, becomes a blaze of colour in early spring to be enjoyed by everyone and adding grace and magnificence to the memorial trees.

The approach to the planting area is made very easy from either one of the two parking areas, with one of the pathways meandering through the wood directly from the top car park which is situated at the main Ince Road entrance. Ince Road, Thornton runs off the A565 and is within easy reach of the motorway network (M57, M58 & M62).

Monies generated from this beautiful site will greatly benefit St. Joseph's Hospice who for many years has provided excellent health care and attention to the deserving citizens of the Borough of Sefton and the City of Liverpool.

Woodland benches donated by well wishers of both the Hospice and 'Life for a Life' are placed in the Memorial Forest for the benefit of those who wish to visit just to enjoy the peaceful ambience and be at one with their own thoughts. As is the case of all of the trees planted by 'Life for a Life' regardless of what occasion the tree is planted for; wedding, birth or remembrance, each individual tree will be tenderly cared for over a period not less than 20 years. St. Joseph's Hospice like many other hospices are always short of much needed funds. They will greatly benefit from the 'Life for a Life' scheme for very many years to come.
